# Proposed bill could lead to MSD referendum

Thursday, December 21, 2023

### **By Anthony Richards**

There is a proposed bill set to go forth before the Florida legislature during the state legislative session this year that pertains to special districts and the rules surrounding them.

The bill was brought to the attention of the Ponte Vedra Municipal Service District during its meeting on Dec. 11 by board attorney Wayne Flowers.

According to Flowers, there is a bill being proposed to the state legislature that if passed would require a referendum to take place in 2025, where the residents would vote to decide whether Ponte Vedra Beach would remain a special district.

House Bill 7013 states that elected





# **Donation helps American Legion post restart operations**

Things are looking up for a local American Legion post thanks in part to a sizable donation made by the Palm Valley Community Association.

Post 233, located at 560 N. Wilderness Trail in Ponte Vedra Beach, has long been a major resource for both local veterans and for the community at large.

Chartered in March 1971, the post has been involved in programs such as Boys State, whereby select high school students travel to Tallahassee to learn firsthand about how state government works. The American Legion Auxiliary offers a similar program for girls.

Over the years, the post has held numerous special events. And its Taco Tuesday, BINGO Thursday and Friday Steak Night, its regular meals and bar have been popular elements of life in Palm Valley. Veterans seeking help connecting with the right people at the VA could always count on the post's assistance.

"The American Legion's an important member of our community," said Greg Leonard, Palm Valley Community Association president.

But in recent years, the post has had some difficulties. Its 501(c)19 tax exempt veteran organization status was revoked in November 2022. As a result, it had to suspend operations, and its income was limited to membership renewals.

In addition, the main building, which the post has occupied since 1974, is showing its age to such a degree that it needs to be replaced.

Past Commander Sonny Kirkwood, a 33-year member of the American

Legion, was asked to return and resume his former role. He agreed and took over commandership on Sept. 17.

Immediately, he called a membership meeting, which was attended by about 100 people, and asked for help in resolving the situation.

Some of those members also sit on the Palm Valley Community Association board, and they advocated for the group to lend a hand.

So, on Nov. 13, the association agreed to donate \$5,000 to the post to cover its operating expenses for a couple of months.

"Because of donations from the Community Center and other American Legion posts, we were able to re-open the doors," said Kirkwood.

At the same time, the IRS approved reinstatement of the post's 501(c)19, backdating it so that all donations as of Nov. 22, 2022, could be tax exempt.

These and other actions have allowed the post to restart its revenue stream. Volunteers, too, have been helpful in the effort

The post now has an 18-month strategic plan. The pavilion is being renovated for use while a new main building is under construction, which is expected to begin in the spring. Gradually, the post's various activities will be resumed, though it is taking "baby steps" toward that goal.

As a harbinger of things to come, the post plans to be open for Christmas dinner from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Dec. 25.

But the post still needs help, especially from volunteers.

members of an independent special district cannot serve more than 12 consecutive years unless the district's charter provides more restrictive terms of office.

However, service of terms prior to Nov. 5, 2024, would not count toward the limitation imposed by the subsection.

"For folks who had already served, it doesn't count towards the 12 years," Flowers said. "So, in other words, it is a 'going-forward' type of legislation."

The bill would also require a continuation referendum to be held every 10 years for independent special districts that exercise ad valorem tax authority. "There are folks who have concerns about special-purpose governments that levy taxes, and that they are not adequately controlled, although there is an entire chapter in the statues that deal with and restrict and instruct how special districts operate. That's something to look at and pay attention to. The Florida Association of Special Districts is following it."

The proposed bill would also repeal a provision that allows a special district to convert itself into a municipality without legislative approval.

Trustee Kitty Switkes asked how it would affect the MSD's charter in the future.

"It would likely supersede it, because it would be a general law and not a special act." Flowers said.

According to Flowers, when discussing changes to the MSD charter in recent years, it was modeled after legislation that had been passed pertaining to school boards around 2020 or 2021.

Trustee Mickey White was curious about what the genesis is behind the proposed law and what led to it.

"There have been efforts to limit authority of special districts at various times for as long as I've been doing this," Flowers said. "A lot of times the impetus is that a legislature in a particular district has a beef with a special district. There was a review that was done when Gov. (Rick) Scott was governor and there was a fear on behalf of special districts that it was going to result in some further action, but there was no legislation that

came out of it."

There are provisions throughout the proposed bill covering a variety of special district types, including independent and dependent special districts, as well as community development districts.

The state legislature's regular session is scheduled to convene on Jan. 9, with the last day for regularly scheduled committee meetings being Feb. 27 and the last of the legislature's regular session coming on March 8.

"Who knows if this will pass or not," Flowers said. "There are thousands of bills that are introduced every year and like maybe 200 to 250 pass."

Flowers hopes to have more information and insight regarding the bill at future MSD meetings.

# Realtors donate \$370,000 to local charities in 2023

result as they do.

The sale closed on Aug. 23, with a purchase price of \$2.2 million. Those funds comprise the lion's share of the \$3.7 million capital campaign launched in 2018 just as Guzzo was taking over the reins of the organization. However, the desire to move into such a facility goes back nearly to the origins of the center.

"A dream has been fulfilled," said longtime member and acclaimed artist Ellen Diamond as she explored the new, second-floor gallery space. "For me, it's been a 25-year dream."

The center was established in 1996. It's original home, a former U.S. Post Office, was located at 50 Executive Way. As one of the early members said Thursday, it was apparent from the start that the building was not going to be large enough to accommodate all that the center wanted to do.

Nevertheless, The Cultural Center at Ponte Vedra Beach, as it was called.

provided numerous art programs, primarily classes and workshops for adults and children, as well as camps for the latter.

Even as the search continued for a larger building, something occurred that perhaps accelerated the process: the COVID-19 pandemic. The center had to close for four months.

According to Guzzo, the outbreak jeopardized all of the center's classes and most of its revenue. Diamond began to offer her painting class online, which helped.

"The online classes really saved us," Guzzo told those assembled Thursday.

Ironically, the online presence even brought Diamond students from beyond the boundaries of the First Coast.

At the same time, in 2020, the center sold its Executive Way building, which was in fact purchased and renovated by Dr. Tim Conway, president of The Morris Center and former Cultural Center board

member.

"Selling that building helped us get through the pandemic," Guzzo said.

The center took up residence at 3972 3rd St. South, Jacksonville Beach, where it operated until this week. This may have actually added to the organization's regional exposure, as reflected in its new name, adopted in July 2021: First Coast Cultural Center.

Through it all, the center hasn't missed a step. It has continued to offer its Sound Connections music therapy program for children with disabilities, its Kick StART afterschool visual arts enrichment program, its annual Beaches — A Celebration of the Arts, exhibitions, youth programs, classes and more.

Settling into its new two-story, 6,000-square-foot home is just the beginning. According to Guzzo, the center's most immediate need is \$500,000 to renovate the space, which includes removing

several interior walls and adding stairs.

As it regards programming, the center will expand its offerings beyond visual arts to include music, pottery, culinary arts and other forms of creative expression.

As a way of generating funds, the center is offering naming rights for each of its spaces, two of which have already been claimed. The main gallery is being named for artist Zena Groover for a sum of \$300,000. Former board chair Joseph Bryant purchased naming rights for the foyer for \$50,000.

In speaking with the visitors Thursday, Guzzo demonstrated her characteristic optimism.

"I am so happy to say that the Cultural Center never has been in better shape," she said, "and its future never has been brighter."

# Sharks pull away from Panthers in fourth quarter

The first matchup of the Ponte Vedra and Nease rivalry on the hardwood this season went to the Sharks, as they fended off a late rally by the Panthers to win 46-42 on Dec. 15.

It was a close game throughout with both teams seemingly even matched for the majority of the contest, with the Sharks only leading by one, 29-28, heading into the fourth quarter.

However, the Sharks (7-3) came out firing to open the final frame as senior Tyler Cowan scored on back-to-back possessions in the post and just like that the Sharks extended their lead to 33-28.

"For some reason we've usually struggled in the third quarter, so it was really nice to come right out like that and get around the rim and get a few buckets," Cowan said. "That was huge and just what we needed."

The big man had a marvelous game around the basket as he scored 13 points and was a force on the boards all night long, including grabbing some key offensive rebounds down the stretch that allowed the Sharks to keep possession and run more clock.

"Anytime we can win the boards, that means you're keeping possession of the ball, which means more scoring," Cowan said.

Another senior who came up massive for the Sharks was guard Sam Ritchie, who finished with a team-high 14 points, and was red-hot from beyond the arc with four three-pointers on the night.

"Once you see one go through, it really gets you going," Ritchie said.

Two of those three pointers helped the Sharks really grab control of the contest during the fourth quarter, the second of which came after Ritchie jumped in front of an intended pass along the sideline at midcourt and then pulled up shortly after and buried a long-range

It was the sixth game this season where the Sharks have held their opponents to less than 50 points, and the Panthers (5-4) had held each of their opponents except one below that mark so far, so Cowan knew going in that the Sharks needed to have a defensive

mindset coming in.

"The main thing was executing on defense, which we were able to do most times, and from their defense leads to offense," Cowan said. "We were able to lock in on defense early on and it just went from there."

Fans from both schools packed the gym on the campus at Ponte Vedra High to watch the action and just walking in it was obvious to everyone involved that it was a different atmosphere then any other regular season game.

"It's a whole different type of energy when you're playing your rivals, especially when you've got friends in the bleachers and on the other team,"

Ritchie said. "It brings out an entirely different type of competitiveness. The most fun thing in sports is playing against your rivals."

The Panthers were led by senior point guard Bryson Utter, who was a focal point of the offensive sets, and the Panthers appeared at their best with the ball in his hands whether that ends in him getting teammates involved.

Utter finished with a game-high 17 points, while fellow senior center Jack Sullivan had 12 points and several blocked shots on the night as he did his part to protect the rim on defense.

# Valley Course still holds its own after more than three decades

The 2023 PGA TOUR Q-School Final was held at Dye's Valley Course at TPC Sawgrass over the weekend and five players earned qualification onto the PGA TOUR for the 2024 season.

In many ways, the event was one of the most important for so many golfers looking to make a name for themselves and get their chance to compete at the top level of the sport.

It was not the first time the Valley Course had hosted a marquee event such as the Q-School Final, as it has also been home to PGA TOUR Champions tournaments, as well as other past qualifiers over the years.

The course was constructed in 1987 adjacent to the THE PLAYERS Stadium Course and although it may not have the worldwide recognition and a famous hole

like the No. 17 Island Green, it has stood the test of time and continues to test the best golfers more than three decades later.

"The thought behind the golf course when we built it was for it to be a sister course to TPC Sawgrass and the Stadium Course," said Bobby Weed, who teamed up with Pete Dye to create the course. "I'm pleased to say that I think we've accomplished that, and it complements it very well."

In fact, over the years, Weed has found many people him that they made the trip to TPC Sawgrass for the opportunity to play the Stadium Course, but they also played the Valley Course and end up favoring that for its style of play even more.

"The hook is the Stadium Course, but they end up often choosing to play the Valley Course twice while they're here," Weed said.

Finding the right mix for both profes-

sional and hobby golfers is the challenge for so many golf courses nowadays.

That becomes even more of a challenge as the average distances off the tee continue to grow for all golfers with the continued advancement in golf club technology and player conditioning.

"You were probably looking at some of the longest players in the game today, because these young guys really love to let it fly and test what all a course has to offer," Weed said.

According to Weed, there are certain ways the Valley Course was adapted in its preparation of the Q-School Final, including narrowing the fairways and letting the rough grow a little longer to increase the skill level required for professional players.

"I'm always amazed at where these guys are hitting the fairways, but it is something that we've seen coming for some time now and it didn't happen overnight," Weed said. "Every 10 years we've been extending our landing area zones (in the fairway). I even have some comics from the 1920s where someone put wheels under bunkers, so it would make them easier to move every so often."

However, despite the growing challenges, Weed is not one that holds onto the past ways and instead believes that the adaptions to the style of play and therefore the courses it is played on, is an interesting opportunity to put a designer's creativity to the test.

"Without a doubt, it's a big challenge for us," Weed said. "It's an exciting time for us as we move forward, because we can be part of the solution."

Harrison Endycott won the Q-School Final by finishing the 72-hole event at 15-under and earning exempt status on the 2024 PGA Tour season.


